Game Fee: \$70 per team weekly - **paid before the game.**

Forfeit fees apply.

The first four (4) games are grading games.

All players participating in this open age ladies competition must be 14 years of age or over.

TEAM INFORMATION

1. Uniform Requirements

- All players must wear a top of the same colour. Players may wear skirts, shorts (no pockets), fitted tracksuit pants (no pockets) or leggings but they must be the same colour as well. For example, a team may choose to wear a white top with navy bottoms. Bodysuits are also permitted.
- No item of jewellery, except a wedding ring and/or medical alert bracelet, shall be worn. If either are worn, each shall be taped.
- Long fingernails must be correctly taped with elastoplast or suitable equivalent. Netball Victoria approved gloves may be worn. DDNA will not allow gloves that need to be fastened by Velcro.
- Teams must provide their own bibs.
- After the grading games, a one-goal penalty applies for each player not in the correct uniform.

2. Game Duration and Breaks

- The quarters played are 9 minutes in duration, with a 3-minute break at half time and a straight swap at quarter and three quarter time. However, players are permitted to change positions and have a quick drink during these breaks. The umpires shall monitor this to ensure it is a quick transition and that it does not impact upon the game.
- Games will start and finish on time. As the venue is centrally timed (except for finals), the clock will not stop. No injury time or 'time outs' will be allowed.
- A team may make any number of substitutions at the end of each quarter, as well as during any stoppage due to injury or illness. If a substitution or team change is made due to injury or illness, the injured or ill player must be involved in the substitution or positional change. The opposing team is free to make substitutions or positional changes, regardless if the team who called for time out makes no changes.

3. Competition Rules & Regulations

- Games are played according to the rules of netball as set by the International Netball Federation.
- Players must be 14 years of age or over to be eligible to play.
- If a team cannot field a legitimate team five minutes after the game's start time, a forfeit will be declared against that team. The awarded score will then be 10-0.
- Forfeit Fees - \$70 for 48 hours or more notice, \$90 for less than 48 hours' notice
- To qualify for finals, a player must have played a minimum of three (3) games for that team, with the first game being played in the first half of the season.
- Fill-ins – Players may be "borrowed" from other teams to assist matches to proceed without incurring penalties.

4. Netball Victoria Registration

Whilst DDNA does not make the annual Netball Victoria registration mandatory for the DDNA night competition, it is highly recommended that players, umpires and coaches be registered. This fee is paid annually per member, and covers members in all Netball Victoria affiliated competitions.

- Juniors players (aged 17 years and Under) - \$58
- Senior Players (aged 18+) - \$78
- Off-court Personnel (administrators, managers, volunteers) - \$46

Netball Victoria registration includes insurance cover for injuries to players. This insurance will cover players for the gap between private health cover and the cost of treatment. It is each player's own responsibility to ensure they are covered by paying their Netball Victoria registration and that they have adequate private health cover.
