## **TEAM INFORMATION**

### **1. Safety of Children and Young People and Member Protection Information**

- a. DDNA is committed to providing Children and Young People with positive and nurturing experiences for healthy development and wellbeing. As part of that dedication to health and wellbeing, DDNA is committed to ensuring the safety of all of its members, particularly Children and Young People. As an affiliated Association of Netball Victoria, DDNA supports their Child Protection Commitment Statement as crucial to in providing a safe environment for children in netball, and consists of principles and benchmarks Netball Victoria has in place for its affiliated Associations.
- b. As an affiliate of Netball Victoria, DDNA adopts all Codes of Conduct, policies and procedures in relation to the Safety of Children and Young People and protection of all members and participants –

- c. All DDNA supervising personnel are subject to Working With Children Checks
- d. It is highly recommended that, to ensure awareness of the safety of children, young people and all participants, the Play By The Rules Child Safety Course be completed - <https://www.playbytherules.net.au/online-courses/child-protection-and-safeguarding-course>

### **2. Uniform Requirements**

- a. All players must wear a top of the same colour. Players may wear skirts, shorts (no pockets), fitted tracksuit pants (no pockets) or leggings but they must be the same colour as well. For example, a team may choose to wear a white top with navy bottoms. Bodysuits are also permitted.
- b. No item of jewellery, except a wedding ring and/or medical alert bracelet, shall be worn. If either are worn, each shall be taped.
- c. Long fingernails must be correctly taped with elastoplast or suitable equivalent. Netball Victoria approved gloves may be worn. DDNA will not allow gloves that need to be fastened by Velcro.
- d. Teams must provide their own bibs.
- e. After the grading games, a one-goal penalty applies for each player not in the correct uniform.

### 3. Game Duration and Breaks

- a. The quarters played are 9 minutes in duration, with a 3-minute break at half time and a straight swap at quarter and three-quarter time. However, players are permitted to change positions and have a quick drink during these breaks. The umpires shall monitor this to ensure it is a quick transition and that it does not impact upon the game.
- b. Games will start and finish on time. As the matches are operated on central time, the clock will not stop. No injury time or 'time outs' will be allowed. However, play will be stopped by the Umpires to ensure injured or ill players are safely removed from the court, or blood-related stoppages are safely dealt with.
- c. A team may make any number of substitutions at the end of each quarter, as well as during any stoppage due to injury or illness. If a substitution or team change is made due to injury or illness, the injured or ill player must be involved in the substitution or positional change. The opposing team is free to make substitutions or positional changes, even if the team who called for the time out makes no changes.

### 4. Competition Rules & Regulations

- a. Games are played according to the rules of netball as set by the International Netball Federation.
- b. Players must be 14 years of age or over to be eligible to play.
- c. The first four (4) games are grading games.
- d. If a team cannot field a legitimate team five minutes after the game's start time, a forfeit will be declared against that team. The awarded score will then be 10-0.
- e. Forfeit Fees - \$70 for 48 hours or more notice, \$90 for less than 48 hours' notice
- f. To qualify for finals, a player must have played a minimum of three (3) games for that team, with the first game being played in the first half of the season.
- g. Fill-ins – Players may be "borrowed" from other teams to assist matches to proceed without incurring penalties.

### 5. Image Consent

- a. From time to time, DDNA may wish to promote the Tuesday Night Ladies Competition and the sport of Netball via electronic media including website and social media.
- b. The taking of such images by means of cameras/mobile devices will be by an authorised representative.
- c. Participant consent will be sought at the time of taking the images.

## **Netball Victoria Registration**

Whilst DDNA does not currently make the annual Netball Victoria registration mandatory for the DDNA night competition, it is **highly recommended** that players, umpires and coaches be registered.

Netball Victoria registration includes insurance cover for injuries to players. This insurance will cover players for the gap between private health cover and the cost of treatment. It is each player's own responsibility to ensure they are covered by paying their Netball Victoria registration and that they have adequate private health cover.

This fee is paid annually per member, and covers members in all Netball Victoria affiliated competitions for the year in which the registration is paid.

## **Personal and Team Responsibilities**

It is the responsibility of Team Captains/Managers to ensure that all players are aware:

1. Of the rules, regulations, policies and procedures governing the DDNA Tuesday Night Competition and which the Association abides by.
2. That all physical activities carry the risk of personal injury.
  - a. Participants are suitably fit to participate in the sport of Netball.
  - b. Participation is competitive and all participants fully accept responsibility for all such risks as a condition of participation.
  - c. While particular rules, equipment and personal discipline may reduce this risk, the risk of injury is still present, and that DDNA court supervisors are not liable or responsible in any way for any injuries incurred.
3. That all personal property and property of individual teams is the responsibility of participants.
